AISD School Based Family Resource Centers

The primary goal of Austin ISD family resource centers (FRCs) is to provide support, resources and leadership opportunities that promote well-being, self-sufficiency and the engagement of family members in our public schools. Family resource centers are located on campus at participating schools and are operated in collaboration with Austin Voices for Education and Youth.

<u>Services</u> - Families with students enrolled in participating schools may receive support from FRCs that may include direct services, referrals, application assistance for benefits, and adult education opportunities in the following areas:

- Housing
- Employment
- Access to healthcare
- Social connections
- Continuing education
