- Padron Elementary School, the largest elementary school in Austin ISD, opened on schedule
- District-wide Performing Arts Center opened on schedule
- Contingency fund projects approved by the Board in December in progress
- Two remaining projects in progress

Phase-I and Phase-II projects ongoing Subsequent phases begin each year in August

## **2013 Bond Projects Status**

## Phase-I and Phase-II projects include critical renovations and improvements such as:

- Replacing HVAC systems, cooling towers, system boilers, water pumps and other components
- Repairing or replacing plumbing and sanitary sewer system components
- Improving ADA compliant student and public accessibility within buildings
- Re-roofing buildings
- Repairing or replacing site and emergency lighting
- Constructing new restroom facilities or renovating existing facilities
- Multi-purpose classroom additions

- Austin, Bowie, Crockett, Lanier and Travis high schools
- Bedichek, Burnet and Fulmore middle schools
- Andrews, Highland Park, Menchaca and Patton elementary schools
- Central Warehouse

#### **Phase-II Facilities:**

- Anderson, Austin, Crockett, Garza
   Independence and McCallum high schools
- Bailey and O. Henry middle schools
- Baranoff, Barton Hills, Casey, Casis, Dawson, Gullett, Hill, Kocurek, Maplewood, Oak Hill, Pease, Pillow, Pleasant Hill, Ridgetop, Sims, St. Elmlo, Sunset Valley, Walnut Creek and Winn elementary schools

## Sustainability

- Austin Energy rebates to date total \$1,850,876
- Guerrero Thompson first AISD school to achieve both Austin Energy Green Building 4-Star and Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) Silver ratings

## Safety

 According to 2012 Bureau of Labor Statics, nationwide contractors had 3.7 accidents per 100 employees; bond issue contractors are trending below this rate with an estimated rate of 1.8 accidents per 100 employees in 2014.

## **2013 Bond Program Technology Projects**

#### **Completed Project**

7,000 teacher laptops replaced

#### **August 2015 Completion**

- Public address (PA) system upgrades
- Replacement of six Supernode generators

#### **August 2016 Completion**

- Network infrastructure upgrades
- Instructional and assessment systems upgrades
- Enterprise Resource Management System replacement (completion 2017)

### Implementation Pending Approval of Superintendent and Board of Trustees

- Refresh classroom computing devices 4 years old and older
- Ensure all classrooms are outfitted with suitable presentation systems and/or projector systems
- Create digital classrooms

## **Historically Underutilized Business (HUB)**

- The CBOC HUB Subcommittee, AISD staff and the District's HUB consultant meet monthly to review HUB participation data tracking and outreach (improved systems are being implemented).
- The HUB consultant met with the Board's Ad Hoc HUB Committee to review progress on the disparity study on February 27, 2015.
- The Board's Ad Hoc HUB Committee reviewed HUB policies, areas related to HUB for which there are no policies, HUB participation in the bond programs, and outreach to HUBs.

- Professional Services Contracts Awarded: \$8,600,213

- Total Contracts Awarded: \$ 17,756,333
