PROCEEDINGS

Preliminaries

- The virtual meeting via Zoom was called to order by Dr. Jane Ross at 4:31 p.m.
- There were no public comments.
- New chief officers of the district introduced themselves, including: Larry Throm, Elizabeth Casas, Dr. Anthony Mays, and Dr. Jacob Reach. In addition, each chief officer cited specific opportunities and challenges in their new positions.

Superintendent's Update

- Dr. Elizalde went over the following points:
 - Latest COVID data.
 - Quarantine guidance changes.
 - Status of accommodations.
 - Post-holiday precautions.
 - Stage 5 implications.
 - Preliminary results of current survey.
 - TEA announcement related to STAAR tests and ratings.
 - Pilot schools looking into possible alternative accommodations.
- · Questions and comments included:

Question: Are we looking into TEA teach appraisal waivers and alternative staffing models?

Response: We will be working on the waivers, and we will continue to explore options for teaching and learning.

Question: Could we somehow consolidate teaching and learning to give teachers some relief? Response: We have to look at so many needs, our options are often limited. And, we can't appear to influence parents not to exercise their right to send their kids to school.

Special Education Overview

- On hand to present was Dr. Akweta Clemmer Hickman, who went over the following points:
 - December second was Special Education Day, commemorating IDEA.
 - Section 504 of IDEA provides for educational accommodations.
 - IDEA ensures free and appropriate public education (FAPE).
 - Admission, Review, and Dismissal (ARD) committees develop individual education plans (IEPs).
 - There are various types of disabilities covered by special education.
 - ARDs are multidisciplinary teams
 - Every student must have an annual goal, backed by an implementation plan.
 - A general education environment is always the first consideration.
 - In AISD, 13% of the student population is in special education.
 - Intellectual disabilities are different from learning disabilities, and really shouldn't be lumped together.
 - Summary of AISD range of services, mission, core beliefs, and priorities.
 - Responsibilities of the district and parents.
 - Successes include improved communications, enhanced professional development, and staffing.
 - Critical issues (in Texas and across the country) include teacher attrition/retention, school psychologists, speech pathologists, and funding.
 - Cyclical monitoring of districts by TEA, including implementation, student outcomes, and stakeholder engagement.
 - Through Results Driven Accountability (RDA), TEA assesses any disproportionality in student groups.
 - We are addressing all student needs during the pandemic.
- Questions and comments included:

Comment: There needs to be more special education program information online for parents, and more on blueprints for instruction.

Response: Information is available for teachers to customize instruction.

Comment: We should share best practices between campuses, and provide supports for instructional coaches as well as new teachers.

Question: Is there any training or information that is required?

Response: There is no mandatory training, but we have a lot of information available to teachers.

Question: During the pandemic, how are special education kids progressing compared to general education kids?

Response: We don't have such a district assessment at this time, although certain schools could be looking at this.
